The Ashley Public School District #9 will hold its annual election on Tuesday, June 6, 2017 in the Ashley High School lobby. Polls will be open from 11:00am to 7:00pm.

The board members whose terms are expiring are Gwyn Schumacher, who represents the city and Trisha Schneider, who represents the at large position of the Ashley school district. Any person residing within the Ashley city limits is eligible to run as the city representative. Any person residing within the boundaries of the Ashley school district is eligible to run as the candidate at large. Candidates for the board must file a statement of candidacy and statement of interest with the business manager before 4:00pm on the third (3) day of April, 2017. There are no petition signatures required for school board candidacy.


