TITLE NEWS

The highlight this month for Title 1 was implementing the new program, Exact Path. The program uses the NWEA testing scores to start students at their own learning level. The students review lessons, practice problems, and complete a quiz. Once they have successfully completed that path, they earn a trophy of mastery. The kids are so motivated to earn the trophy that they ask to use the program every day.

The upper elementary students used their math skills to measure the Title room. They found the area and the perimeter of the room, measured the furniture I said was a must have, and used their creativity to redesign the room. They needed to keep in mind the safety and practicality of the space. Using their math skills, they needed to prove their layouts worked. The focus this month has been on time, money, place value, and math facts.

In Title 1 reading, we have read many different books. We are working on recognizing words, chunking, predicting, and reading comprehension. We played Inference, Around the World (Getting the Main Idea), and Cause and Effect to practice the skills we are working on in the classroom. The younger students played sight word bingo and practiced forming sentences.

Ashley and Wishek School Boards adopted the below Sportsmanship Guidelines.

SPORTSMANSHIP GUIDELINES

South Border believes fans should be positive roles models for our youth and respected communities. Each fan is expected to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner during South Border events home and away. The following are recommendations from the Sportsmanship Committee.

• Fans that engage in disruptive behavior at games can be evicted from event by Referees or Administration on duty. Coaches can make recommendations to administrator on duty if they wish a fan to be ejected, but final decision rests with administration on duty.

Should a fan be evicted from an event (first strike) they may be required to sit out the next home game of that sport (with carry over to next year if applicable). If fan is evicted from another event (second strike) they may be banned from all South Border home events for one fiscal year from date of second eviction.

Each additional evictions may result in an automatic ban of one fiscal year from eviction.

Elementary Computer Literacy




