TITLE NEWS

Title Math students in the lower elementary grades have been studying different addition and subtraction strategies. They have also been working on place value and expanded notation. We enjoy using playing cards and dice in the classroom to practice our math skills.

Title Reading students have been working on context clues to figure out meanings of unknown words, identifying the speaker of the story, main idea, and idioms. Our focus has been reading non-fiction passages in the upper elementary grades. We have been learning strategies to do better on comprehension tests, such as re-reading, carefully reading the questions to figure out exactly what they are looking for, writing in complete sentences, and to glance over the assignment to make sure all questions are answered.

The State FFA Officers facilitated this conference. Students were in large and small group settings learning how to get out of their comfort zone and meet people.

Elementary Computers

For the month of January, the focus for Grades K-6 is to increase their keyboarding skills. Pre-Kindergarten is focusing on correct mouse usage and reading a computer screen. The following is an excerpt from *Keyboarding Without Tears*:

Why Handwriting & Keyboarding Are Important

Both handwriting and keyboarding are skills students need to master in order to produce effective written work. These two skills work together in the classroom to create an engaged, balanced, and successful learning environment. Handwriting is taught in the beginning of elementary school and is mastered toward the end of the elementary years. Keyboards are introduced in the elementary environment with fluency expected in Junior High. Both handwriting and keyboarding are essential, lifelong skills that develop through proper instruction over time.

There are numerous research studies and articles that establish the relation between writing and keyboarding. These two skills require very different forms of instruction. The techniques and timing for teaching them is critical in order to adhere to developmentally appropriate instruction in the classroom.



Pre-Kindergarten

The PreK class has been learning about their 5 senses and how each are used. We are beginning to use our 5 senses to be able to understand stories on a higher level. This is our shared writing senses poem for the story Owl Moon by Jane Yolen.

History:

February was added to the Roman calendar in 713 BC. The length of the month changed over time and, at one time, it had as few as 23 days. When Julius Caesar remade the Roman calendar, the month was assigned 28 days during normal years and 29 days during leap years which occurred every four years.

Fun Facts about January

- It is the shortest month of the year.
- The Welsh call February "y mis bach" which means "little month".
- It is the third month of winter.
- In the Southern Hemisphere February is a summer month the equivalent of August.
- The month is named for the Latin word februum which means purification.
- Together with January, it was the last of the months added to the Roman calendar.
- The largest American sporting event of the year, the Super Bowl, is held in February.
- The Saxon term for the month, Sol-monath, means "cake month". This is because they offered cakes to the gods during this month.
